Arland D. Williams Jr.,

September 23, 1935 to January 13, 1982



Arland had a fear of water his entire life. Yet, this 47-year-old bank examiner found himself in the frigid ice-covered water of the Potomac River following the crash of Air Florida flight #90.

Impact killed 73 of the 79 on board. Though he was offered a lifeline from a news helicopter five different times, he passed up the chance for being saved by giving the rope to the other five survivors.

Williams exemplified compassion, integrity, honor, and self-sacrifice. If you visit our nation's capital, stop at the Arland D. Williams Jr. Memorial Bridge and say a prayer of thanks for people like him.



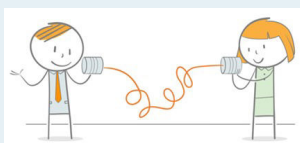
Streaming Message

Henderson Settlement began in 1925 to meet the needs of the community. Today, the need is even greater, but the ministries and those necessary to lead are also increasing:

Workcamp does projects at the Settlement and builds a house for a family in need annually, much as Habitat for Humanity does.

Youth Ministries gets young people involved in service projects, helps with tutoring, offers scholarships, provides various school and sports activities, and summer recreation.

Grow Appalachia provides skills and resources to grow sustainable nutritious food, teaches healthy food prep and preservation, does soil testing, and hosts a Farmer's Market.

The Greenhouse and Farm are endeavoring to practice sustainable and profitable business models for the community to grow plants, raise animals, and harvest intelligently.

Food Pantry (free) and Thrift Shop (low cost) are true lifelines when families are struggling to make ends meet, wondering about their next meal, or how to clothe their children.

MIHOW Infant Support assists mothers-to-be through the child's 3rd birthday. They assure neo-natal care and the "How to's" of meeting the physical, mental, and spiritual needs of their children.

Additionally, there is Senior Support, a Craft Shop, a Library, Women's Support, and other ministries.

HS offers ministries, even via long-distance that's a perfect fit for you. Tell them Pastor Dave sent you, and they'll put you to work and prayer.

Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective. James 5:16
NIV

Why should we confess our sins to each other? We don't really want everyone to know our sins, do we?

The short answer is, "YES." By confessing our sins to each other we can hold one another accountable to try to live lives that are pure and blameless, lives that model Christ, whose name we bear.

What about the prayer of a righteous man—I'm not righteous. Again, the short answer is, "YES." We are. We are not righteous of our own integrity, but we are righteous because of what Jesus has done and is doing in and through us.

Isaiah 53:5 says, "He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His wounds, we are healed."

Confess, be thankful; and live in the Lord's righteousness.

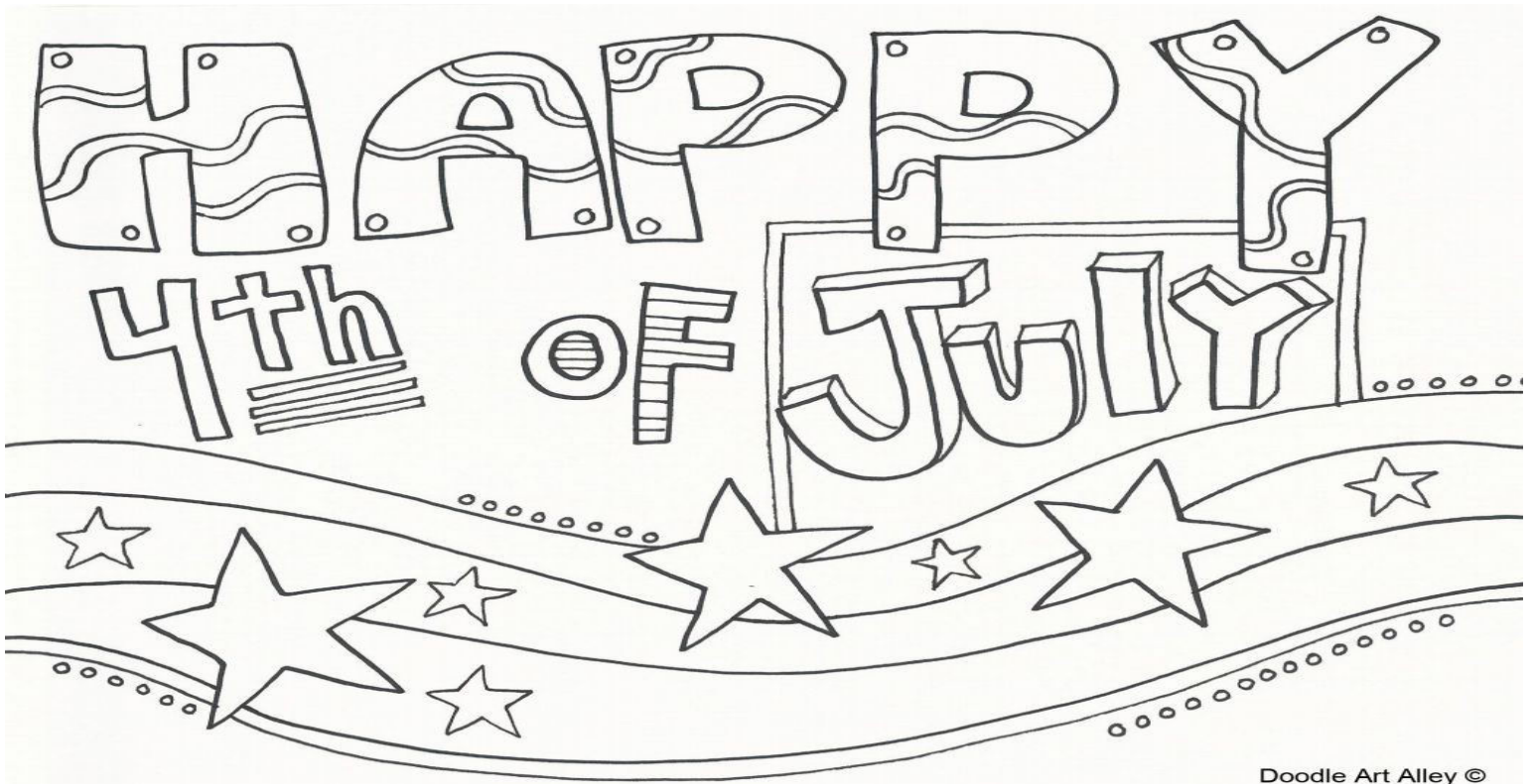
